**New Requirements for International Travelers**--From the U. S. Department of State's website: "Beginning January 23, 2007, ALL persons, including U.S. citizens, traveling by air between the United States and Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and Bermuda will be required to present a valid passport, Air NEXUS card, or U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner Document, or an Alien Registration Card, Form I-551, if applicable." **'Murder,' she Googled**—From the website: "A New Jersey woman on trial for murdering her husband in April 2004 did a Google search on the phrase 'How to commit murder,' exactly 10 days before she allegedly shot him to death, according to a digital technology expert, who worked for the New Jersey State Police. Melanie McGuire, 33, also did searches on Google and MSN for 'undetectable poisons,' 'fatal digoxin levels,' 'instant poisons,' 'toxic insulin levels,' 'how to purchase guns illegally,' 'how to find chloroform,' 'fatal insulin doses,' 'poisoning deaths,' 'where to purchase guns illegally,' 'gun laws in PA,' 'how to purchase guns in PA,' and 'where to purchase guns without a permit . . .'"
