Government Publications Library—Maintained by the University Libraries of the University of Colorado at Boulder, this extensive online collection “consists of over five million items in paper, microform, video and electronic format. The Library receives over ten thousand current serials.

How Our Tax Dollars are Spent--“The National Priorities Project analyzes and clarifies federal data so that people can understand and influence how their tax dollars are spent.” A recent report, “The President's War Request: Local Costs Updated,” includes a table showing, as of May 7, 2008, for each state, how much money has already been allocated to the Iraq war, what the additional amount under consideration will cost, and what that money could buy in local services instead.
